Youth

Several exciting things have been happening with the youth dancers.

California Family Jamboree at Disneyland – Scheduled August 4 & 5, 2006 in Garden Grove and at Disneyland. Registrations continue to come in for this first-time event. Advance registrations must be received by July 22nd to guarantee discounted admission to Disneyland, but anyone is welcome to join in the dancing once they arrive at the amusement park.

Scholarship – Revised CA Youth Scholarship applications are available. If you know of a youth dancer who is the equivalent of a high school senior or above, but will not be 21 prior to May 1st, encourage them to apply for the State's college scholarship. This \$500 scholarship is good for any college, university, community college or trade school the student wishes to attend.

National Convention – State Youth Chairman Bonnie Abramson participated as a seminar speaker with John & Alitia Becker, USDA Youth Chairmen, at the National Square Dance Convention in San Antonio, TX. Their program covered ways to get youth involved in square dancing and programs being offered by California and the United Square Dancers of America. The program was well received by those in attendance.

Bonnie and Bob Kamuf also attended a panel put on by three youth dancers discussing what they liked and didn't like about square dancing. Among their "pet peeves" were adults who refused to dance with them, being made to feel "un-welcome" at dances, and adults who assume that because they are kids they don't know what they are doing. They also stated they like all kinds of music, especially the high-energy stuff, but not necessarily rap tunes. They want to be able to kick up their heels and have the opportunity to "show off" a bit – but really like being able to dance with adults who appreciate them.

Also at the National Square Dance Convention the California Youth Program hosted the youth after party on Saturday night and was extremely popular. Nearly 8 squares of youth participated in the after-hours event.

During the USDA's (United Square Dancers of America) annual business meeting held in conjunction with the National Square Dance Convention, delegates voted to have USDA support the concept of youth square dance competitions as a way of promoting youth dancing. Examples of several forms of competition were reviewed.

Fun Weekend – There was a great turn-out of youth dancers again at Fun Weekend, many who had not danced before but took a turn at learning the ropes during one of the introductory sessions. Led by their youth dancers, the Elk Grove Hoedowners took the third place overall trophy, while the River City Rugratz seized the fifth place trophy. Adobe Squares of Petaluma, also with a strong contingent of youth dancers, came in second overall.

State Fair Dancing

We will be square dancing one night during the 2006 California State Fair, on Sunday, August 27th at the Kitchen Craft Stage. Dancing will be from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., featuring Scot & Erin Byars as the caller and cuer.

Admission to the fair will be free when dancers enter any of the regular admission gates wearing dance attire and their club badge. Parking is on your own and it is recommended that you carpool to save money.

Dancers participating with the square dance demonstration are required to comply with the State Fair's Megan's Law policy by submitting their full name, date of birth, driver's license or ID number and the state issuing it and residential zip code for submission to the fair. Forms have been provided for each club and there is an additional sign-up sheet being circulated during the meeting. A copy of the form will also be available on the ASDSC website. Names and other information must be submitted to Bonnie Abramson no later than August 15, 2006 to be forwarded on to the State Fair. Even if you aren't sure you will be able to attend, it's better to submit your name in advance and not show up then to stay away because your name has not been submitted.

It is my understanding that the Promotions Director is preparing the flyer regarding dancing at the State Fair and for Progressive Squares Day, and will be providing the new dancer class information that will be distributed at the fair.

The contract has been received; it will be signed and returned to the fair by next week.
