Executive Committee & Board of Directors Meeting
November 1, 2009 – Veterans' Hall, Royer Park, Roseville, CA

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING: Due to time constraints with the hall, there was no Executive Committee meeting held.

ASDSC BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING: The ASDSC Board of Directors meeting was called to order by President Zell at 12:10 p.m., followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

ATTENDANCE: Secretary Bonnie Abramson called roll, with the following individuals present: Joanie Clayton (Apple Jacks & Jills); Mike Barnes (Buttons & Bows); George Fox (Capital City Squares); Steve Riley (Diamond Dancers/Youth Chairman); Carolyn Matthies (Free Spirits/Historian); Robert Green (Goldancers); Leo Springer (Main Street Strollers); Ruth Moore (Mavericks); Carol Hayek (Overalls); Ray Zelinski (Patchwork Squares); Corky Bolin (Prime 8's); Mary ___ (Sacramento Single Squares); Denise Springer (Sierra Squares); Don Herd (Starlite Shufflers); Arlene Cook (TNTs). Officers in attendance included Christine Zell (President); Bob Kamuf (Vice President); Bonnie Abramson (Secretary/Caller Procurement); Suzanne Cari (Treasurer/Summer Sensation Chairman); John Zell (Membership); Mitchell Cari (Harvest Hoedown Chairman/Immediate Past President); and Morrie Weisbart (Webmaster). Guests in attendance included Gene Booen and Clay Spindler. Good Vibrations, Guys & Dolls and Whirl-a-Ways were not represented. A quorum was declared with 15 clubs present.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Christine Zell

CLUB YEAR END REPORTS: President Zell is still looking for the year-end reports for each club. If you have not submitted your report please do so as soon as possible.

DANCE CALENDARS: Clubs are asked to please submit their 2010 and 2011 dance calendars to Morrie Weisbart as soon as possible. We would like to make every effort to not have conflicting dates in the future so lets work together to resolve any conflicts.

VACANT POSITIONS: We are still looking for individuals or couples willing to serve as the Sunshine Chairman and Promotions Director. If you are interested, or know of anyone who might be interested, please contact President Zell. Erin Byars has volunteered to assist the Promotions Director by making the flyers, etc., if the person is interested. President Zell also noted how much we appreciate all of the hard work and effort Keron Weisbart put into the job of Sunshine Chairman for the past several years. She did a great job and we will really miss her. *(Secretary's note: Mike Barnes has graciously volunteered to serve as the Promotions Director. Thank you, Mike!! Now, we still need a Sunshine Chairperson.)*

VICE PRESIDENT: Bob Kamuf

NOMINATIONS: Vice President Kamuf gave a report on nominations for officers for 2010. They are as follows: President – Christine Zell; Vice President – Bob Kamuf; Secretary – Bonnie Abramson; Treasurer – Gene Booen; Membership – John Zell; Webmaster – Morris Weisbart. The Promotions position is still open. The following recommendations were made for Appointed Chairpersons: Harvest Hoedown – Mitchell Cari; Fun Weekend – Suzanne Cari; Caller Procurement – Bonnie Abramson; Youth – Steve Riley; and Historian – Carolyn Matthies. The Sunshine position is still open. There were no additional nominations or volunteers from the floor. A motion was made by Don Herd (Starlite Shufflers), seconded by George Fox (Capital City Squares), to cast a white ballot for all positions. Motion carried.

SECRETARY: Bonnie Abramson

Secretary Abramson reported the minutes were sent out via e-mail and posted to the website. A motion was made by Mitchell Cari (IPP/Harvest Hoedown), seconded by Carolyn Matthies (Free Spirits/Historian), to approve the minutes as distributed. Motion carried.

TREASURER: Suzanne Cari distributed a written report.

BANK ACCOUNTS: Suzanne verified that the checking accounts have been moved to Chase Bank and that the Bank of America accounts were closed. She will make sure all records are cleaned up and ready to transfer to the new Treasurer. She also noted that Guaranty Bank, where we have our CD accounts, has been sold. Suzanne has been assured by bank officials that our interest rates, etc. will remain the same.

DANCER ENHANCEMENT FUNDS: Suzanne had questioned why we hold separate accounts for the general funds and the dancer enhancement funds. She had checked with our accountant with the response being that separate accounts are not necessary for tax purposes. Final decision on this will be left for future discussion.

REPLACEMENT CHECK: A check was written to Placer County for rental of the Veterans Hall, but the check was misplaced. Suzanne has notified Eric from the Vets Hall to not cash this check if he finds it since the account has been closed. If necessary, we will replace this check.

INCOME/EXPENSES FOR YEAR: Suzanne reminded board members that Association membership dues come in at the end of the year for the following year, so our income for the year looks low right now as 2009 membership dues showed up at the end of 2008 and we are just beginning to get in 2010 dues.

COUNCIL ADVANCE: President Zell requested a \$300 advance to attend the State Council meeting in San Diego. A motion was made by Mitchell Cari (IPP/Harvest Hoedown), seconded by George Fox (Capital City Squares), to approve the advance. Motion carried.

MEMBERSHIP: John Zell (written report)

RENEWAL/2010 MEMBERSHIP FORMS: Director Zell reported that membership documents had been e-mailed to all clubs in October, with snail mail versions sent to those without e-mail. Morris Weisbart also posted the forms on the website. As of this meeting John had received forms and payment from 12 clubs. (*see written report which also highlighted which clubs had not yet submitted their forms*). John also noted that it is taking six-to-eight weeks to get insurance forms so if your club needs a certificate in January your time is rapidly running out. Insurance certificates will not be requested for a club unless membership dues and the other paperwork have been submitted. One change to note is that a separate form is required to list club members who have paid their dues through another club.

Currently there are 103 new dancers listed, and 425 regular dancers. Clubs are asked to provide complete name, address, phone number, etc. for all dancers for Association and insurance records.

PROMOTIONS: Position Vacant

CLUB LISTINGS ON THE WEBSITE: President Zell had received reports from people who were trying to visit clubs based on information found on the website. However, the club might have been "dark" or moved location. Clubs need to keep Morrie informed of any changes in dance location, schedule or other information changes so he can keep the website updated.

IMMEDIATE PAST PRESIDENT: Mitchell Cari. No Report

HARVEST HOEDOWN: Mitchell & Suzanne Cari, Chairmen

WOW!! We had a GREAT festival. Mitchell noted that they didn't know how to thank everyone. 38 squares on the floor during the opening tip after the Grand March on Saturday, and we still had 38 squares on the floor in the Plus Hall at 9:30 that night. The callers, committee and everyone all did such a great job. All of the halls were filled, and at best count we had 68 squares on the floors at one time. There are 17 commemorative T-shirts left, so if you'd like one, please see Mitchell or Suzanne. President Zell commended the youth dancers for working together to make newer youth dancers feel welcome. It is very important that we all continue to help promote all of our festivals to help make them successful. Bonnie Abramson (Caller Procurement) commented that we received some very nice compliments from featured caller Tony Oxendine.

PAST PRESIDENTS: It was great to see all of ASDSC's living past presidents at Harvest Hoedown. They had a group dinner and then were introduced during the Grand March.

PROMOTION: Great promotion for this year's event and we need to keep up the good work in that area.

SUMMER SENSATION: Suzanne Cari

We're trying to give new life to this festival. Callers will be Jet Roberts and Hunter Keller. We need everyone's help to promote, with ideas, suggestions, etc. Plan to have a casino night, bingo and to revamp the other games.

DRESS CODE: Need to vote on the dress code. Square D and Cloud 9 have said they will not participate as vendors based on the preliminary decision to have no square dance attire requested for this event. Some discussion followed, including wording that would request square dance attire for Saturday night only. Suzanne felt strongly that we should not have any dress code and will talk to the vendors again.

NAME CHANGE: A motion was made by Morrie Weisbart (Website), seconded by Robert Green (Goldancers), to officially change the name of Fun Weekend to Summer Sensation in all the appropriate documents, including the Bylaws, Standing Rules and Guidelines, and wherever else necessary. Motion carried.

WEBMASTER: Morris Weisbart (written report)

E-MAIL ADDRESSES: Had two bad addresses, now corrected. Clubs reminded to keep Morrie informed of any contact information changes.

STATE CONVENTION: We need to support the State Convention in Fresno, April 9 – 11, 2010. New format – first time with hired callers. All are “world class” callers. AMTRAK is a good way to travel if you don't want to drive.

CALLER PROCUREMENT: Bonnie Abramson.

HARVEST HOEDOWN: All contracts for 2009 Harvest Hoedown were completed, including those for local callers and cuers. We have formally cancelled Tim Crawford's contract for 2010 and a signed replacement agreement for 2011 has been received. A signed contract has been received from Tim Marriner as a replacement for Tim Crawford in 2010. Bonnie is in talks with Mike Seastrom and a couple of other folks for 2012, and Tony Oxendine has agreed to come back in 2012.

SUMMER SENSATION CONTRACTS: Bonnie reported that all contracts except one have been returned for Summer Sensation 2010. The exception is Bill Silver – his contract calls for two nights RV parking but they are giving up their RV and would like that to have that changed to one night in a motel. The chairman is agreeable to this change. Bronc Wise has agreed to call in 2011 if we are interested, but Bonnie had not finalized any plans until we get a formal motion to continue the event after 2010. A motion was made by Morrie Weisbart, seconded by Suzanne Cari, to continue Summer Sensation after 2010. Motion carried.

FUTURE EVENTS: Bonnie asked for input on callers, and especially cuers, that the dancers would like to see at future events. She also explained some of her strategy in booking callers, and that some are just out of our financial limits.

Suzanne Cari complimented Bonnie on her efforts on behalf of the Association in booking callers. She found out how much other Associations pay for their callers and realized that Bonnie has negotiated some very good contracts on behalf of the the Association.

FIFTH SATURDAY DANCES: Bonnie asked for feedback on callers for future 5th Saturday dances – did we want to continue with out-of-area callers or do more with local callers. After some discussion, it was agreed we should try to go to more of a European format to get more dancing time in. Final decision was the Winter dance (January – May) would be Mainstream/Plus/Single Round; Summer dances (June – July) would be Full Plus with Double Rounds; and Fall Dances (September – December) would be New Dancer/Plus/Single Round. All of these formats would offer a full hour of rounds prior to the beginning of squares for the evening. If the fifth Saturday dance falls in August, we will offer an Intro to Square Dance program, followed by one-half hour of rounds and then intro dancing/plus/single round.

HISTORIAN: Carolyn Matthies. The new historian book was available for viewing at Harvest Hoedown. So far has only received an inventory from the Secretary; anyone having ASDSC-owned equipment in their possession needs to be sure they report it to Carolyn. Send inventories to her at twinkletoes1955@sbcglobal.net. The missing hearing enhancement equipment has been located and turned over to Scott Pearce. If any club needs to borrow the equipment for a dance please contact Scott.

SUNSHINE/BLOOD RESERVE: Vacant

BLOOD RESERVE: President Zell reported that 22 additional units of blood had been donated since our last meeting. The Association’s account number is #1375. Someone brought up that we need to have clubs complete the blood donor forms to have their club members qualified, but they were not included in the membership packets. John Zell will get those out to the clubs.

SUMMER SENSATION 2011: A motion was made by Morrie Weisbart (Webmaster), seconded by George Fox (Capital City Squares), to proceed with plans for Summer Sensation 2011. Motion carried.

YOUTH: Steve Riley reported he was excited to see so many youth dancers at Harvest Hoedown, especially the ones from the Vacaville area. The USDA Youth Scholarship (\$1000 value) application deadline is February 1st and the California Youth Scholarship (\$500 value) application deadline is April 1st. If you know of any youth dancers who are seniors in high school or under the age of 21 encourage them to apply. He also noted that the Vaca Valley Ramblers plan to split their membership and have some join ASDSC and some join the Northern California Square Dance Association since they fall in the middle of the two Associations.

OTHER ITEMS: Christine Zell

FIFTH SATURDAY DANCES:

DANCE LEVEL/FORMAT: Some discussion on the format of our dances. It was decided for most dances we should do one hour of pre-rounds followed by a format of Mainstream/Plus/Single Round then Mainstream/Plus/Single Round. (No round or break between the Mainstream & Plus Tips). This will keep more dancers on the floor while alternating levels. For any June or July dance we would do just Plus level with Two Rounds between tips.

LOCATION: With price increases rent is now the same to use Royer Park (wood floor) as the Orangevale Grange (concrete floor) so it was recommended we schedule future 5th Saturday dances at Royer Park. Unfortunately Royer may not available be in July, which would mean us going back and forth between facilities. A motion was made by Bonnie Abramson (Secretary), seconded by George Fox (Capital City Squares), to move the dances to Royer Park if we can get the hall consistently, but if we cannot get Royer in July we should stay with Orangevale Grange until we can make a “permanent” move to Royer. Some discussion. Motion carried with 5 opposed. President Zell will check with Eric at the Vets Hall (Royer) to get clarification and a schedule.

HOSTING DUTIES: The schedule had been distributed to the clubs for hosting 5th Saturday dances. Ruth Moore again brought up the issue of Advanced level clubs not wanting to support the dances, and of having all of the Roseville area clubs work together. She felt the Association board should just do all the work. Discussion followed that ALL clubs should do their part to co-host one dance per year, no matter what level the dance. Vice President Kamuf was assigned the duty of looking at the rotation once again to see if we could come up with a better solution combining “close” clubs with “distant” clubs and clubs of varying membership sizes. He will report at the next meeting. Treasurer Cari also suggested a monetary assessment against any club that does not participate/support the dance when it is their turn in the rotation.

INAUGURAL BALL: President Zell announced the Inaugural Ball was set for January 18, 2010, at Royer Park. It was noted that this was the same weekend as WinterFest in King City and several board members were planning to attend that. President Zell said she might change the dance to January 10, 2010. *(Secretary’s note – the Inaugural Ball has been scheduled for January 24, 2010 at Royer Park.)*

NEXT BOARD MEETING: The next ASDSC Board meeting is also scheduled for January 18, 2010.

Secretary Abramson noted that several board members had indicated they planned to go to WinterFest that weekend, and that she and Vice President Kamuf would be in Tucson, AZ, attending the USDA Winter Meetings since they are now on that Board. A motion was made by Bonnie Abramson (Secretary), seconded by Suzanne Cari (Treasurer), to move the January meeting of the ASDSC Board to January, 24, 2010. Motion carried with 1 opposed.

APPLE JACKS & JILLS: Written Report

BUTTONS & BOWS: Mike Barnes reported that the club will have their annual Christmas Dance on December 12th at the Placer County Fairgrounds in Auburn with Jet Roberts and the Ghost Riders.

CAPITAL CITY SQUARES/PRIME 8's: Written report. Corky Bolin reported the clubs will be holding their 28th Anniversary dance on November 21st with Mike Kellogg calling. Afternoon advanced session; evening mainstream/plus dance at Bell Avenue School. Spring dance will be held February 6, 2010, featuring Andy Allemao.

FREE SPIRITS: Written Report. January 21st A1 beginners class and refresher course begins.

GOOD VIBRATIONS: Written Report.

MAINSTREET STROLLERS: Written Report of scheduled dances for 2010. Betty Hiatt reported they will be holding their annual SHARE dance on December 5th with Scot & Erin Byars. Bring canned goods to share for discounted admission.

MAVERICKS: New Year's Eve dance with Bronc & Jet; November 14th dance with Phil Smith.

OVERALLS: Written Report. Carol Hayek reported club members are starting to go out to dinner before dances to try to get more people involved. December 19th Silver Bells dance with Mike Sikorsky and Charlie Eskin – Whirl-A-Ways afternoon plus from 3:00 to 5:30 p.m.; Overalls Plus evening dance.

Insurance & Membership Report November 1, 2009

At the beginning of October 2009, I sent an E-mail to all the Club POCs through the ASDSC Website. In the e-mail I included instructions and documents that needed to be completed to identify club members, clubs classes, requests for insurance and new this year was a list for dancers insured through other clubs with the clubs name listed. Those clubs with difficulties receiving or printing insurance documents were sent them by US mail.

To-date I have received documents and checks from eleven out of eighteen clubs. For those seven clubs I have printed an insurance packet for hand delivery.

Requests for Insurance takes 6-8 weeks, so those with dances in January, that have not submitted a request for insurance as well as 2010 club rosters with dues could be running in to a problem getting their insurance certificate.

The committee worked extremely hard to make this anniversary festival a success. We were graced by the attendance of all of the living past Presidents of ASDSC. And State Council was represented.

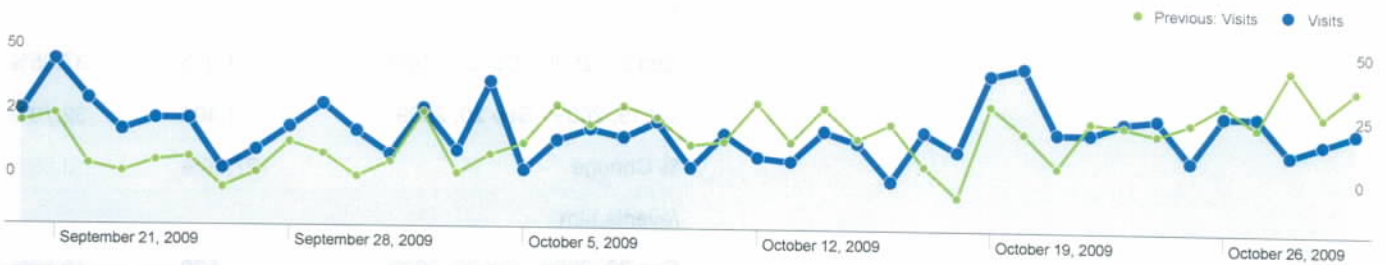
I would like to personally thank all those committee members who gave of themselves to make this festival something special.

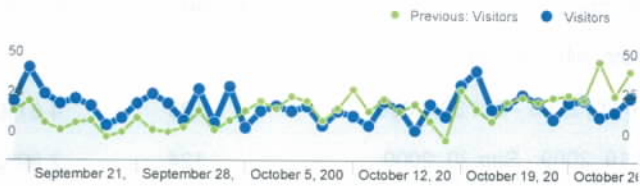

Bonnie Abramson notified Jerry of the meeting tomorrow and he forwarded the email to me. Sorry to inform that GOOD VIBRATIONS will not be represented at the meeting. Sundays are nearly impossible for me and many in our Club. Jerry will not be able to represent me this time. I hope the meeting goes well anyway. Bonnie said you wanted a report from each Club, so I'll give you a short update below to use as you see fit.

GOOD VIBRATIONS SQUARE DANCE CLUB IS ALIVE AND WELL! Over the last two and a half years we have come from barely able to floor one square and running out of money, to easily flooring four squares each Club night and seeing our bank account growing. We just had Officer elections for 2010 and had plenty of candidates willing to serve. We also rewrote and passed new By-Laws. We are about one month into our current New Dancer Class with lots of good students. We have 15 or so members who are interested in Round Dance Classes and we will soon be considering a Class on a separate night. Our current Board will invite the 2010 Officers to join us next month in planning out next year's schedule.

There are no "secrets" to a successful Club, but there are some requisites. Growth of Square Dancing will not just happen; it must be intentional! Some of the things we intentionally do, in no particular order, are:

1. WE HAVE FUN, MAKE A LOT OF NOISE AND LAUGH A LOT!
2. WE HAVE FOOD AND A VARIETY OF BEVERAGES AT EVERY DANCE, AND A LOT OF FOOD ON PARTY NIGHT.
3. WE HAVE A THEMED PARTY NIGHT EVERY MONTH.
4. WE WEAR INFORMAL ATTIRE. SQUARE DANCE OUTFITS ARE NOT ENCOURAGED!
5. WE KEEP ANNOUNCEMENTS TO A BARE MINIMUM.
6. WE ARE RAMPING UP 50/50, LAST WEEK GIVING AWAY NEARLY \$300.00 IN CASH AND PRIZES.
7. WE PROMOTE MEMBER INTERACTION AND PARTICIPATION ON A PERSONAL LEVEL IN SEVERAL WAYS.
8. WE SHAMELESSLY PROMOTE OUR CLUB LOCALLY.
- 9 WE FOCUS ON "OUR" CLUB.
10. WE TRY TO "NIP IN THE BUD" ANY NEGATIVITY AND NOT TAKE OURSELVES TOO SERIOUSLY.
